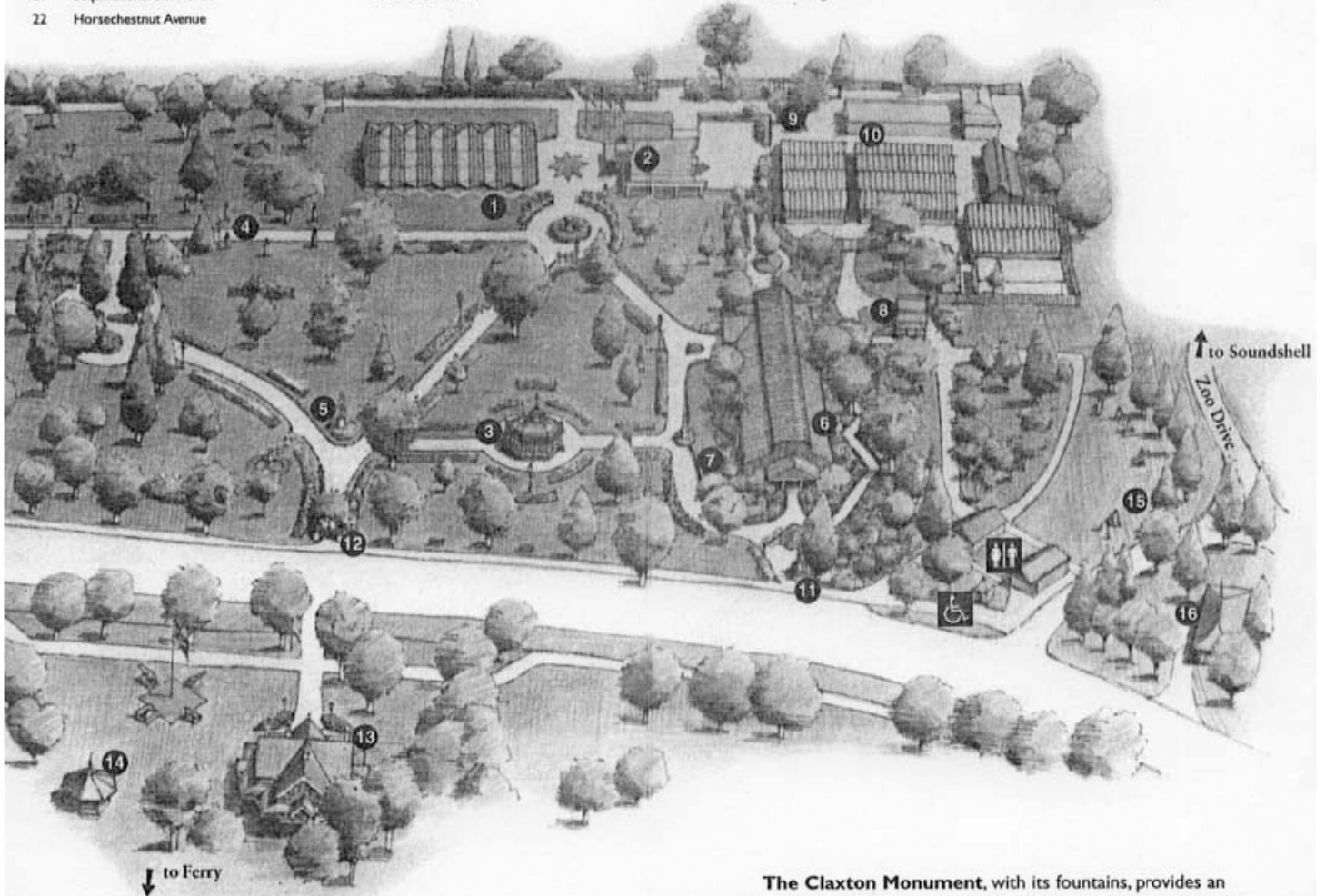

are a dominant landscape feature. Note the long arching low branches which show signs of generations of children's play. Other landmark trees include the Turkey Oak at the entrance to the Prime Ministers Avenue, the Druids Oak at the rear of the Craft Cottage, the huge Bluegum dominating the Sensory Garden and the Weeping Elms near the wishing well.

The Statuary Pavilion houses Ballarat's finest collection of marble statuary, the result of the Thomson and Stoddart Bequests. Charles Summer's Flight from Pompeii, Ruth, Modesty, Rebeka and Susannah are elegant reminders of Ballarat's wealth of the 1880s. The pavilion is popular for wedding ceremonies and performances by artists, particularly during the Annual "Arts in The Park" program.

The Claxton Monument, with its fountains, provides an appealing and welcoming entry to the fernery, which is a tranquil haven in summer and shelter from the elements in winter.

The Floral Clock, a gift from the Begonia Festival Association, was relocated from Sturt Street to the Gardens in 1980.

The Morey Gates, located at the main entrance, display intricate cast ironwork and frame the pair of century old marble lions that greet visitors as they approach The Conservatory.

The Dahlia Garden displays a large collection of hybrid dahlias annually from March to Easter.

The historic **Lake Pavilion Restaurant and Kiosk** are located on the Lake Foreshore immediately opposite the Morey Gates. Catering ranges from a la carte dinners and functions to afternoon teas and take-away fare from the kiosk.
